

## Missouri Voters’ Public Opinion: Issue Priorities and Ratings

The following document summarizes the opinions of likely voters in Missouri on issue priorities and ratings of conditions. These results were gathered via SLU/YouGov Poll surveys conducted between 2020 and 2026, and the queried conditions included the economy, schools, crime, race relations, infrastructure, and respondents’ health. The SLU/YouGov Poll is a biannual survey of likely Missouri voters aiming to inform policymakers, citizens, and researchers of Missourians’ opinions on important issues facing the state.
